# **Mark Lasky-Davison**



I'm a 2019 graduate (Bachelor of Fine Arts) from The Victorian College of the Arts school of Film and Television. My films have screened at festivals in Australia and overseas, including St Kilda Film Festival.

I am currently working on a psychological sci-fi (a psy-fi) set in the Victorian high country. I also play drums in two bands, one Indie and one Metal. I hope to continue combining my love for rhythm and film with a career as a Director and Editor.

Film is a gorgeous, powerful medium and I'm honored to pursue a career working with it.

#### **DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT**

I've always interested in exploring the quiet spaces between people, and the philosophical framework of pottery was a great way to investigate this.

My conversations with potters while researching for the film taught me that in pottery, process is more important than outcome; that you need to move smoothly and be in the moment; and that there is a kind of "Zen" about pottery. All of these things apply to the relationship between Fred and Mavis.

My intention with Bisque was to focus on the performance of the actors, and to let the characters unfold – following the process instead of the outcome in a way that I tried to make as unobtrusive as possible.

The beauty of the pottery is echoed in the beauty of the landscape that I set the film in.

I wanted to make a film that avoided all the clichés – there is no sexual tension, no power-plays, no violence. There is a wonderfully sweet and wry humour that plays out through the sometimes jokingly sarcastic banter between Mavis and Fred.
